Allstate will be stocking largemouth bass, channel catfish, mosquito fish and bluegill. Weed-eating grass carp will be introduced with permits from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to assist in aquatic weed control programs. Residents and anglers are welcome to attend this popular event, and each community will receive a certificate of fish stocking.

"A balanced, healthy fish population benefits the aquatic environment because it can help to absorb nutrients in the water and control undesirable weeds, insects and other aquatic pests, as well as to provide recreational enjoyment for residents," said Andy Fuhrman, Executive Director of Allstate Resource Management, Inc.
