ALLSTATE RESOURCE MANAGEMENT'S FISH STOCKING

Spring Event Will Have A Positive Impact on South Florida's Aquatic Life

DAVIE, FL – Allstate Resource Management, Inc. recently performed a sample fish stocking event at the University of Florida's Open House on January 21, 2012. The demonstration, which took place at the Research and Education Center in Davie, was to educate Broward residents of the upcoming Annual Spring Fish Stocking (April 2012). Stocking of native largemouth bass, bream, channel catfish, shiners, and mosquitofish occurs each year for waterway systems in the communities managed by Allstate. The company also stocks weed-eating triploid grass carp to assist in the control of undesirable vegetation in lakes. The carp are a biological control agent and require a permit from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Allstate staff will make permit applications to the agency for clients.

Hundreds of thousands of non-native fish die in South Florida ponds, lakes and waterways every year as a result of winter weather and other natural causes. Allstate's Annual Fish Stocking is important because it introduces eco-friendly native freshwater fish and natural balance back to South Florida's ecosystem. It revitalizes aquatic life.

"A balanced, healthy fish population benefits the aquatic environment because it can help to absorb nutrients in the water and control undesirable weeds, insects and other aquatic pests, as well as to provide recreational enjoyment for residents. "We will be stocking native fish throughout South Florida" said Andy Fuhrman, Executive Director of Allstate Resource Management, Inc.
